REPORT.

THE Committee of Lady Managers are pleased to present another report. The health of the children has been excellent. It will be noticed in the accounts that the sum for Medical Attendance (including chemist, &c.) has decreased.

The children have continued to attend the Holy Trinity National Schools, towards the funds of which the Lady Managers have contributed a guinea.

Miss Ellis, the Head Mistress, reports, "I have pleasure in again commending the general conduct and work of the Blue Coat Girls attending Holy Trinity Schools. In "Conduct" I would like to praise Ada Liniker in the Upper Division, and Esther Brown and Emma Bullivant in the Lower Division, for their invariable amiability and sweetness of character shewn equally in 'blame' as in 'praise.' In Religious Knowledge Ellen Easter and Lottie Priest gained places in, the 1st Class, and Mabel Archer in the 2nd Class in the Diocesan Written Examination of June last. * * In Needlework the girls shew most credit able progress and skill."

Two girls have left the School and each has made a good start. Two former scholars came before the Committee in the course of the year to receive rewards for good conduct.

Gifts of various kinds have been sent to the children by Miss Soames and Miss Airy. A lady living on Blackheath, having been interested in the School by Miss Airy, has most kindly undertaken to supply the household with tea to the value of £5 yearly; the first case of tea arrived in October.

Grateful mention must be made of the action of the Greenwich Borough Council, who, in consideration of the School being a Charitable Institution, have lowered the rates to a merely nominal sum.

In November, Miss Upton, a member of the Ladies' Committee, wrote an account of the School which was inserted free in the Blackheath Local Guide. As a result of this several subscriptions and donations have been received. The large increase in the contributions this year is, however, mainly due to the kind gift of £50 from R. J. Wenborn, Esq.

The Committee have to deplore the loss of two old subscribers, the Rev. G. Gates and Miss Huskisson, and to welcome new subscribers in H. E. Lawrence, Esq., J. K. Soames, Esq., and Mrs. Waugh, and to thank "A Trustee" and Mrs. Harvard for kind donations towards the funds of the Institution.

In the Balance Sheet an increase will be noticed in the housekeeping expenses, which is mainly due to the rise in price of provisions. The Committee cannot present their report without again testifying to the unfailing care and kindness bestowed on the girls by their Matron, Miss Howarth. They feel that not the least of the advantages given to the children by the School is the opportunity of gaining such a kind friend and adviser; her wise training in the School is a great thing, but the Committee are glad to notice year by year how lasting her influence is on former pupils who visit her from time to time and ask her sympathy and advice.
